**P.O. A. SIDNEY F. HOLMES,** R.C.A.F., son of Lieut.-Col. and Mrs. A. W. Holmes, Halifax, and formerly of Toronto, who was reported missing when his Halifax crashed near Dusseldorf, Germany, April 23, 1944, 's now presumed dead. In 1937, P.O. Holmes enlisted in the former 110th Squadron of Toronto and went active in 1941. After training as an air-gunner at Dunnville, Jarvis and Mont Joli, he went overseas in December, 1943, and took part in several operational flights over enemy territory. Before enlisting he had been associated with the **3rd Toronto** Boy Scout troop and attended the Church of the Epiphany. Other members of the family include three sisters, Kathleen, with the R.C.A.F. (W.D.) at Pennfield Ridge, N.B.; Mrs. Malak Karsh, Ottawa; Anna Jean, with the R.C.A.F. (W.D.), Yarmouth, N.S., and two brothers, Donald, with the 1st Canadian Army in Europe, and Alan, of Rothesay Collegiate school, Rothesay, N.B. His father is with the R.C.A.M.C. at Halifax where his mother also resides at present. P.O. Holmes is a nephew of Sidney D. Holmes of the Ontario department of education, Toronto.
